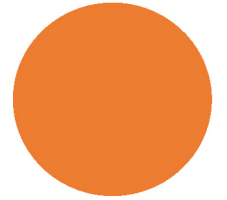

Montoya said that mindfulness is a natural way for a person to cope with anxiety. Coping tools can be important to keep in mind, as, according to Montoya, there are folks out there who are trying to make money off of people's anxiety. He said that just in Sutter County, for example, there are 89 tobacco retailers.
