Phillip Gardiner, DrPH

African American Tobacco Control Leadership Council (AATCLC)

PRESENTATION: The importance of local action on flavors and tobacco control, in order to help support the state and federal work.

Dr. Gardiner is a Public Health activist, administrator, evaluator and researcher. For the past 25 years, he has worked on studies ranging from Hypertension, Multiculturalism and AIDS, to Breast Cancer, Prostate Cancer, Diabetes and Smoking. For the past 20 years, Dr. Gardiner has lectured around the country on African American health disparities generally and menthol smoking in the Black Community, particularly. Dr. Gardiner recently retired as the Senior Program Officer for the Tobacco Related Disease Research Program (TRDRP), University of California Office of the President, a position he had been in since 1997. Dr. Gardiner is currently the Co-Chair of the African American Tobacco Control Leadership Council (AATCLC), a group of Black professionals dedicated to fighting the scourge of tobacco impacting African American communities both in California and Nationally.

American Heart Association Communications Director – Central Valley

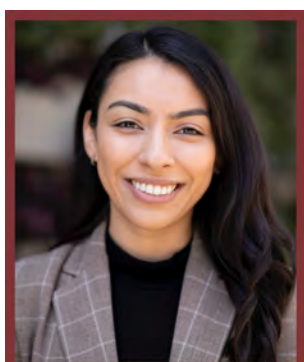
PRESENTATION: Paid Media Strategies.

Anna Song, PhD

Associate Professor & Director of the Nicotine and Cannabis Policy Center

Dr. Anna Song is an Associate Professor of Health Psychology and Director of the UC Merced Nicotine and Cannabis Research Center. She received her BA in Political Science and Psychology at University of Michigan, Ann Arbor in 1998. She completed her PhD in Social-Personality Psychology at UC Davis in 2006, as well as a two-year post-doctoral fellowship at the Center for Tobacco Control Research and Education at UCSF, before joining the faculty at UC Merced in 2008. The overarching aim of her research program is to identify psychosocial mechanisms that explain the onset of risk behaviors, with a special emphasis on ethnic differences in risk and health behavior prevalence and onset. Risk and health behaviors of interest include nicotine and marijuana use and weight loss behaviors. Much of her work involves longitudinal statistical modeling of large, epidemiological datasets and is often interdisciplinary.



Juan Flores,

Public Information Officer - University of California, Merced

Juan Carlos Flores is a public information officer for the University of California, Merced. He joined the External Relations team in March 2021, but this isn't the first time he's been a part of the university. As a UC Merced graduate of the class of 2009, Juan was one of the pioneer students that arrived on campus as it prepared for its grand opening in 2005. He has more than 10 years of experience working in TV newsrooms, mainly in Los Angeles and Fresno. He has held several positions, including digital news producer, newscast producer and assignment editor. Most recently, he was in charge of writing web stories for the CBS Evening News with Norah O'Donnell. Juan has been in the trenches of a newsroom during several high-profile events, including the 2012 mass shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Connecticut, the 2013 Asiana Airlines flight 214 crash at San Francisco International Airport, and most recently the 2020 presidential election.
